Damaged screw remover

I have found a tool which may do the job of removing a deep recessed damaged cross headed screw from the underside of a locomotive for instance (which was my problem) although I managed to remove before this piece of equipment arrived at my door.

The tool is Made by TREND and is called a MICROGRABIT.

It consists of four double ended hex bits. The four sizes are from 3mm to 6mm.

A cheaper version with just two sizes is also available.

A slow rotating forward and reverse drill is required.

You begin with drilling the top of the screw with one end of the appropriate sized hex bit and then reversing the direction of the drill using the other end of the hex bit to hopefully extract the damaged screw. I'm sure you have had occasions of this type of problem and know the procedure.
